At CPA Forum 2005, a panel of distinguished business leaders will discuss the issues raised in *The Agenda* and how they affect you, your business and the wider economy.



The Panel Discussions

In Session 1, panellists consider the fallout from Enron, WorldCom to CAO, whether ethics can, in fact, be legislated. They will also look at the changes made by the regulators in the region.
